A BBC survey has found that Manchester is thought to be England's second most important city ahead of Birmingham. The poll revealed 48% of people thought Manchester was second behind London, compared to 40% choosing Birmingham. This is despite Manchester being far smaller than the Midlands city and reveals people consider other aspects when they think of the "second city".

Architect Ian Simpson, who has helped shaped the skyline of both cities, said: "What I think Manchester has at the moment is that it just has a cool edge. I think most people know it's a bit cool to be here, to work here, and to be part of this."
